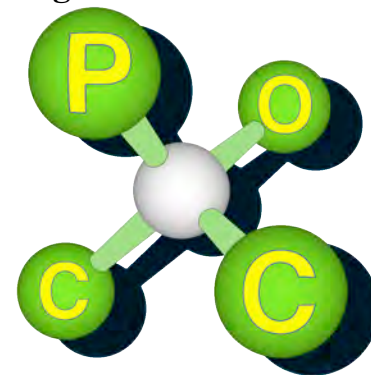

Ryan A. Shenvi was born in 1981 in Wilmington, DE. He received his B.S. degree with honors and distinction in chemistry from Penn State University, where he was a research student in the laboratories of John Desjarlais and Ray Funk. He earned his Ph.D. as an NDSEG predoctoral fellow with Phil Baran at The Scripps Research Institute, and then joined the laboratory of E. J. Corey at Harvard University as an NIH funded post-doctoral fellow. Since 2010, he has been an Assistant Professor in the Department of Chemistry at The Scripps Research Institute.

Abstract: Our lab aims to develop concise chemical syntheses of complex molecules that are relevant to human health. These efforts frequently require the invention of new chemical reactions that are applicable beyond the original context. Some of this work will be presented.
